Bulgarian TV coverage - We got some air time recently when the Bulgarian national TV network BNT2 did a news item on a TrashedWorld event. TrashedWorld collaborated with Anglia School and the European Assication of Teachers to put on a workshop for teachers and a viewing the Trashed documentary.





FACTWorld CLIL Teachers' Meeting - FACTWorld is a global network of over 3500 teachers all interested in CLIL and interschools collaboration and exchanges. This meeting brought together teachers from Bulgaria (Plovdiv, Burgas, Hissarya) and abroad (Turkey) for a day-long workshop on CLIL Projects, hosted by Anglia School, Plovdiv. There was a strong thread which discussed developing 'life skills' in the curriculum. There were many ideas to follow up with from this event. All are listed below.

Trashed Movie Viewing - In the programme of the day's workshop we had a showing of the documentary Trashed which we opened to all-comers, including the teachers at the workshop and this brought more visitors to Anglia School to watch the film. A recent development is that we managed to prepare Bulgarian subtitles for the film, and this means that it can be viewed by non-speakers of English. The film was followed by energetic discussion and more ideas for things we can all do to develop a sustainable lifestyle.

Follow up -

- Nearly all of the colleagues who came to the workshop expressed a desire to develop TrashedWorld in their curriculum and teaching! They will be given a free subscription to the programme.
- Daniella Hristova from the French School in Plovdiv will continue her fabulous work on the project with an extra-curricular group of enthusiastic students at the school.
